Thanks to you, our founders, and many visionaries over the past 22 years, we continued with our mission—despite the COVID-19 pandemic. Together, your support has built, sustained, and prepared your Community Foundation for the trials we all experienced in 2020.

*It is in these challenging times that I can truly see **We Are All in This Together.***

As individuals, we have been forced to isolate and distance ourselves from others, complying for the promise of a safe and bright future. Together, we have sacrificed and taken our creativity to new heights in support of one another. I have seen such good work by so many individuals in our community, selflessly challenging themselves to make sure our communities, schools, and organizations survive these trying times.

Together, and thanks to your contributions, we awarded over \$85,000 in community grants in 2020; our total grants exceeded \$262,000. Despite a difficult year -- but again thanks to your support -- our assets have increased from \$9.9M to \$11.1M.

Together with White County United Way, we worked swiftly to establish and support the COVID-19 Community Relief Fund for local non-profits financially affected by the pandemic. Together with a Lilly Endowment grant, we raised \$436,438 to serve three counties, distributing \$124,995 in White County in 2020.

Together and individually, your CFWC Governing Council members accepted a challenge from Lilly Endowment. Thanks to each member's generosity, CFWC was awarded a \$100,000 unrestricted grant (see p. 2 for more details). To quote Yoko Ono, "A dream you dream alone is only a dream. A dream you dream together is reality."

On behalf of your Community Foundation of White County, please know how much we appreciate your contributions. What you do truly matters. And because of you, we can make the promise of a bright future our reality.

## Lilly Endowment Board Engagement Challenge

As part of its GIFT VII initiative, Lilly Endowment offered a \$100,000 unrestricted grant, provided 100% of Governing Council members gifted a minimum amount (set by LEI) to CFWC. Your Governing Council members not only answered the call but exceeded the goal! Truly, CFWC's leadership team believes... and leads by example.

Half of the grant will be used to establish a CFWC Operating Endowment; another portion for upgrading office technology, another for future building maintenance, and a meaningful portion for proactive grantmaking.

# Leadership White County

The eighth cohort of Leadership White County welcomed 16 enthusiastic participants in the fall of 2019 and held six monthly sessions before COVID mandates eliminated its final regular session.

Nevertheless, a postponed and scaled-down graduation ceremony was held in August, celebrating White County's newest community leaders!

Your community foundation serves on the LWC core team and has awarded several grants to support this valuable program.

A Regional Cultivation Fund, WHIN's third component, is focused on education, creation of vital communities, and

connectivity. With a grant from the Cultivation Fund, Tippecanoe Arts Federation launched its WHIN WALLS initiative, inspiring and funding outdoor murals in local communities, including two in downtown Wolcott.

Your Community Foundation of White County continues to participate in and benefit from initiatives being developed within the Wabash Heartland Innovation Network (WHIN).

WHIN's mission is to develop our 10-county region as a large-scale, living laboratory for education and scientific research related to Internet of Things (IoT) technologies.

## Coronavirus Response

March 2020 brought devastation to the world when the coronavirus pandemic hit, bringing forth a “new normal” of mask wearing, quarantining, remote working, home schooling, social distancing, and more.

## Rising to New Challenges

Our Governing Council awarded five pro-active grants to address immediate food insecurity needs: \$1000 each to our four county school corporations, who took the lead in their respective communities, and the White County Food Pantry.

In its Spring Community Grant cycle, CFWC awarded \$13,662

to seed White County United Way's COVID-19 Community Relief Fund, later funded with a major grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. Together with the Community Foundation of Pulaski County, the Jasper Newton Foundation, and CFWC, the Community Relief Fund has provided significant community relief to service agencies and

organizations in need of assistance during the pandemic.

**Unrestricted funds** are used to address ever-changing needs and opportunities within the community, allowing maximum resources and flexibility for CFWC grantmaking.

**Designated funds** assure annual support for agencies named by the fund's founding contributor.

**Donor-advised funds** allow founding contributors to make annual grant recommendations to the CFWC for approval. By law, recommendations are not binding, but CFWC takes them seriously and approves grants to local nonprofits that meet charitable and financial standards.

**Field of Interest Funds** allow donors to select areas of interest (e.g. arts, education, recreation, etc.) without designations to specific entities, allowing CFWC to address grant requests received in these broader areas.

**Agency Funds** help ensure annual support for our nonprofits' programming and services.

Supporters may create or contribute gifts at any time and in any amount, including memorials and bequests.

**Special Project Funds** support donations non-permanent or short-term nonprofit initiatives that benefit the community. These funds are not placed into the endowment/investment portfolio.

**Scholarship Funds** may be created so that you participate in the selection process or leave recommendations up to CFWC.

*Because the Community Foundation of White County is a public charity, donors receive the maximum deductions allowed by law. And remember – you may donate to any fund with any amount at any time.*
