



Committed to continue growing in the field, Lucy graduated in 2022 from the John M. Mutz Philanthropic Leadership Institute. Congratulations, Lucy! We also were able to bring in Ben Getz as Executive Assistant, and he is already contributing so much to the organization. We also can't forget our CEO David Lasater who lends his invaluable support and expertise from the Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette, our affiliate.

CFWC's mission remains to strengthen and transform White County. By participating in Lilly Endowment, Inc.'s GIFT VII initiative, we were able to dive deeper into the needs of our community and the experiences of those living here. We hosted Rural Community Solutions to conduct community conversations last spring and compiled what we learned with county-specific data. Through this discovery, we identified and proactively awarded two grants to address immediate needs and continue to use this valuable data to guide our mission.

We continue supporting leadership initiatives in the community and thank our many partners who know that when we work together, we work better. Initiatives like Leadership White County strengthen and challenge our community's leaders to think more broadly. Our Women Giving Together Fund offers opportunity for people to get engaged in the grantmaking process, while making a difference collectively. Wabash Heartland Innovative Network awarded a Regional Cultivation Grant for us to launch a new youth philanthropy council in White County, an exciting program designed to develop the next generation of philanthropic leaders!

In 2022, CFWC had 10 new funds established, received over \$1.3M in gifts, and we awarded over \$356,000 in grants. All of this is possible because our generous donors, partners, and volunteers work tirelessly to strengthen and transform White County.

Community Conversations

As a part of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT VII Planning Grant, your Community Foundation commissioned Rural Community Solutions to engage in a series of community conversations with residents of White County in order to ascertain the aspirations, concerns, and actions the citizens feel are important to the future well-being and growth of White County. This information was compiled with other county-specific data to build a comprehensive report, available in the foundation office.

In response to immediate needs that were uncovered, CFWC awarded two proactive grants to improve access to mental health services and other social services needs for our most vulnerable populations. We continue to use this data to guide our mission.

Your Community Foundation of White County continues to participate in and benefit from initiatives being developed within the Wabash Heartland Innovative Network (WHIN).

WHIN's mission is to develop our 10-county region as a largescale, living laboratory for education and scientific research related to Internet of Things (IoT) technologies.

Funded by a \$38.9M grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc., two primary focus areas are Digital Agriculture and Next-Generation Manufacturing.

A Regional Cultivation Fund,

WHIN's third component, is focused on education, creation of vital communities, and connectivity. With a grant from the Cultivation Fund, CFWC is launching its very first Youth Philanthropy Council. With representatives from all four White County high schools, this group of philanthropic leaders will be charged with awarding grants to support their school systems.



Women Giving Together Fund

The Women Giving Together Fund was established in 2006 by a small, but mighty, group of women that strongly believed in the power of collective philanthropy. Annually, over 100 women join this movement with donations big and small to support area agencies that serve White County women and children. Since its inception, over \$148,000 in grants have been awarded from the WGT Fund, supporting initiatives across the county.

The Fund's annual fundraising luncheon welcomed guests to the **Brandywine Convention Center** in June to celebrate women in philanthropy and to honor 2022's WGT grant recipients. Being the first time that this luncheon could be held since 2019, grant recipients from 2020 and 2021 were honored as well, making this year's luncheon bigger and better than ever. Although the mission of the fund was still being carried out during those two long years despite the loss of the annual luncheons, it is with great excitement that we get to see the Women Giving Together (in person) again!




